Topic

Cooperating with citizens and other local stakeholders, engaging them to develop projects, implies a change of attitude for the local authority and new participatory governance approaches. How can this be achieved? How can we draw on tried-and-tested methods?

Keywords: citizen involvement – changing community's attitude – facilitating dialogues between relevant actors – supporting the change

Site visit: Grette Brulard area

Participants will learn about the citizen engagement initiatives undertaken by the city of Besançon such as the citizen savings for the Maison des Femmes project, the Schools Plan and the Vaites conference. After they will make a visit to the Grette Brulard development project. The project aims to convert a 25-hectare site close to the historic center into 600 housing units.

The city of Besançon plans to make this district an example of the principle of rebuilding the city on top of the city, offering a new opportunity to develop alternative housing to individual homes with high environmental standards while ensuring a balanced social mix. To achieve this, a particularly advanced participatory process was carried out with residents. The choice of pre-greening the site, which reverses the development process, is also unique.

Testimonial workshop - City Stories of citizens engagement on the energy transition
